Eliminating Obstacles to Gardening: Green Thumbs, Healthy Joints Grant 2017

Once again, Putnam County Aging Program received a gardening grant to benefit seniors with arthritis and joint issues.

Last year the provider established raised garden beds at each of their Putnam County centers, which have been lovingly tended and are now in full bloom.

This year's grant will enable each center to establish a perennial garden and offer seniors an opportunity to explore vertical gardening.

As part of the grant, special gardening tools for those with arthritis and other joint related conditions were purchased. Ergonomic gloves, which offer protection for the skin yet allow pressure to be alleviated from the joints, were also obtained.

In addition, Putnam County Aging purchased an ergonomic garden shovel, allowing those with arthritis to comfortably dig up the ground for the perennial planting.
