Services provided include meals and transportation, in-home care, Alzheimer's respite, wellness, long-term care advocacy, senior employment, and Medicare counseling.

What is an Aging & Disability Resource Center (ADRC)?

An ADRC is a professionally staffed office that assists seniors and persons with disabilities to navigate the state's long-term care system. ADRC professionals help individuals locate and apply for those services that most suit their independent living and long-term care needs.

A limited number of ADRCs began in 2003, funded by the federal government. Statewide ADRCs began in 2007, as a result of funding provided by Governor Joe Manchin III and the West Virginia's 78th Legislature.

Who is eligible for ADRC services?

ADRC services are available for anyone over 60 years of age and individuals with physical disabilities over 18 years of age. Additionally, services are available for anyone acting on behalf of those individuals. There are no medical or financial eligibility criteria.

What services are provided?

The ADRCs help to empower individuals to make informed choices about their long-term care needs, by providing resource information, coordinating services, and following up to ensure needs are met. Examples of long-term care services are nutrition, personal care, Medicare counseling, medical equipment, and legal assistance.

How many hours of service can be provided, and who provides them?

An individual will receive as many hours as needed to locate and coordinate services. Assistance is provided by specially trained social service professionals who are employed by the ADRC.

Is there a fee for ADRC services?

There is no charge for services provided by the ADRCs. Donations are accepted.
